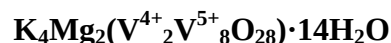


Bluestreakite

Crystal Data: Monoclinic. *Point Group:* 2/m. As tablets or blades, to 0.3 mm, flattened on {101}, elongated along [010] and exhibiting {101}, {101}, and {120}; typically as granular coatings.

Physical Properties: *Cleavage:* None. *Fracture:* Irregular. *Tenacity:* Brittle. Hardness = ~ 2 D(meas.) = n.d. D(calc.) = 2.350 Very slowly soluble in H₂O.

Optical Properties: Transparent. *Color:* Very dark greenish blue. *Streak:* Light blue. *Luster:* Subadamantine.

Optical Class: Biaxial (-). $\alpha = 1.750(5)$ $\beta = 1.800(5)$ $\gamma(\text{calc.}) = 1.829$ $2V(\text{meas.}) = 73(3)^\circ$

Orientation: Z = b. *Pleochroism:* Weak, dark greenish blue. *Absorption:* X < Y ≈ Z.

(1) Blue Streak mine, Bull Canyon, Montrose County, Colorado, USA; average of 42 electron microprobe analyses, VO₂ and V₂O₅ apportioned and H₂O determined from structure analysis; corresponding to (K_{3.37}Na_{0.15})_{Σ=3.52}Mg_{1.94}(V⁴⁺_{1.40}V⁵⁺_{8.60})O₂₈·14H₂O.

(2) K₄Mg₂(V⁴⁺₂V⁵⁺₈O₂₈)·14H₂O.

Occurrence: A secondary mineral in the oxidation zone of roll-front U-V deposit in corvusite-montroseite-bearing sandstone.

Association: Gypsum, huemulite, hummerite, metamunirite, munirite.

Distribution: From the Blue Streak mine, Bull Canyon, Montrose County, Colorado, USA.

Name: For the mine that produced the first specimens.

Type Material: The Natural History Museum of Los Angeles County, Los Angeles, California, USA (64174, 64175).
